Wrapping Paper

Newspaper and kraft paper are easy to recycle. Gift wrap with metallic ink, foil or glitter is considered a landfill item.

Naughty List

- Glitter, foil or velvet
- Artificial trees and decorations
- Styrofoam
- Plastic utensils
- Bows and ribbon
- Tissue paper
- Toys





Packaging

Styrofoam is also a landfill item.
Instead, use crinkled up paper or bubble wrap to protect your fragile gifts. Packing peanuts in good condition are accepted at many shipping stores.



Greeting Cards

Skip the glitz - these are not recycleable. Instead, use recycled paper for your cards. Receive a sparkly card? Reuse it as a gift tag or frame it as holiday decor.

Decorations

Artificial holiday decorations are not recycleable. Instead of placing them in the garbage, donate gently used items to your local resale shop or host a holiday decor swap with your coworkers.

Paper Boxes & Bags

Bubble wrap & air pillows (pop first!)
Cardboard boxes
Catalogs

Batteries

All battery types are recycleable at the Pleasantview Drop Off Center for residents at no cost. Be sure to tape the terminals!

String Lights

Holiday lights can be recycled with electronics for a fee. Remove any glass bulbs prior to drop off.

Metal Christmas Tree Stands

These are considered scrap metal and can be recycled at no cost to you.

Reduce

Rather than giving an item, think about an experience: movie or concert tickets, car wash or parking tokens, dinner reservations, cover a monthly membership, subscription, or donate to a nonprofit in their name.

Encourage waste reduction by gifting a reusable water bottle, straw or sandwich bag.

Reuse

By purchasing used, you are saving energy and natural resources. Find fantastic buys at area resale and thrift stores.

Tissue paper is a non-recycleable item that can be reused in many ways: use it in a craft project, donate to a preschool, art class, library or save it for a future gift.
